North Attleboro High School Success Stories

MCAS – Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System

- Awarded Level 1 Status, up from Level II status, where only 24% of schools in the Commonwealth have Level 1 Status, resulting from hard work and collaboration amongst the learning community.

Advanced Placements

- Second year in a row the district has been placed on the College Boards Advance Placement Honor Roll. The following criteria has been met:
 - Simultaneously, achieved increases in access to Advanced Placement courses for a broader number of students and maintained or improved the rate at which AP students earned scores of 3 or higher on an AP exam.
 - 2014 – 2015 Academic year AP expansion will include AP Physics and AP European History

Bristol County Savings Bank Grant

- BCSB awarded NAHS with a grant to fund the freshman “Step-Up-Day” which provides incoming freshman an opportunity to familiarize themselves with NAHS as well as meet the faculty.

Respectful Learning Environment

- Three young ladies placed positive quotes on each and every student locker. This story made local and national news.

Technological Improvements

- NAHS was the proud recipient of a \$6M grant for the renovation of the NAHS science labs, the first major upgrade to the school since it was built in 1973. The project was completed in September 2013. NAHS now includes 12 state-of-the-art science labs with new furniture and technology.
- NAHS now has three wireless mobile labs including 30 laptops and a WiFi printer for each. The English, History/Social Studies and Science Departments are the proud recipients of this technology.
- The district is moving to Microsoft Office 365, which will provide the opportunity to access Office Web Apps online.
- The district Libraries are now using the web based version of Follett’s Destiny software.

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
